Efforts to enhance vibrancy of Wallace

Good things are happening to add to the beauty and vibrancy of our town. Some of these efforts are clearly visible—such as flowers and flags gracing our downtown—others are more behind-the-scenes or in the works.

Here is a brief look at three such efforts.

Flower power

If you're thinking there are a lot more flowers downtown than in past years, you are absolutely right! There are 117 baskets, many are in pairs and flanked by an American flag. Thanks to Art Fleming, Jon Ruggles and many other volunteers (including a group of women from Spokane) for potting and hanging the baskets and for the local residents who are helping keep them watered. Funds from the City and private donors have made this project possible.

Visitors Center

For a majority of tourists,



the Visitors Center is the gateway to Wallace. The facility offers a wonderful mining exhibit, great maps and brochures, and friendly, helpful volunteers. Then. there are the restrooms: toilets that are hard to flush, a broken sink, flickering lights, aging plumbing. That's about to change. The City has earmarked some of the megaload money to fix the bathrooms,

helping make visitors' first impression a favorable one.

Storefronts

The Chambers of Commerce and the Silver Valley Economic Development Corp. would love to see the Valley's empty storefronts filled with new businesses. Hopefully that will happen some day, but until it does, the three entities are working together to explore measures to let potential business own-Flower baskets go up in Wallace. ers know what is avail-

able and see the possibilities that each location offers, and to give tourists and locals some informative and interesting displays as they walk by the storefronts.

The SVEDC is taking a lead on this project and exploring possible assistance from the State, either financial or advisory. Watch future Chamber newsletters for updates on this project.

Megaloads provide winter windfall for businesses, city

The megaloads that were a familiar site to residents last winter and spring, and a godsend to local hotels and restaurants, are over, but more such business may be in the future.

Mayor Dick Vester said the parking lot that was the staging area will soon be restored to its previous condition. He said he would like to see the second exit remain, how-

ever, to accommodate large trucks that use the lot. Vester said the transport company Mammoet was so impressed with Wallace that it has indicated it may want to use the staging area again in the future. The city received \$70,000 from the lease agreement with Mammoet, money that is benefiting several projects and providing a cushion in the city's budget.

Liquor store moving

The liquor store on Cedar Street is closing and being replaced by a new state liquor outlet in the former American West Bank location in Harvest Foods in Wallace. The outlet is expected to be open by July 4. Jeff Anderson, director of Idaho State Liquor Division in Boise, said location, space and volume were considerations in closing the Cedar Street store.

"The Cantamessas are excited about this and we expect there will be top-level, A++ customer service at their location," Anderson said. Harvest Foods is owned by the Cantamessa family.

Anderson said this change will also enable the State to add staff and extend weekend hours at its Kellogg store, including Sunday openings.
