A big "Thank You" to the Frank A. Morbeck Foundation

The Historic Wallace Chamber of Commerce, along with many other organizations and students, once again was a beneficiary of the generosity of the Frank A. Morbeck Foundation.

The Foundation gave out \$83,950 in grants in April, assisting a wide variety of community events and youth projects.

The Chamber received a \$3,319 grant to purchase an event tent (details in the June issue), \$1,800 for the 3rd annual Accordion Festival, and \$250 for banners and signs. Other major community recipients included the Blues Festival, \$4,000, the Historic Stairs Project, \$3,000, and Wallace District Mining Museum, \$2421. Awards of \$2,000 each went to the downtown holiday lighting project, Sierra Silver Mine Tour, Northern Pacific Depot Foundation, Nine Mile Cemetery Association, Wallace Baseball, Wallace Senior Center, and

Historic Wallace Preservation Society. Youth projects that were funded included \$4,000 to bring the Missoula Children's Theater to Silver Hills Elementary School, and \$2,000 each to youth golf, basketball, wrestling, football and TSA programs. Smaller gift were given to many other school and youth activities.

The Foundation also gives numerous student scholarships each year.

Over the years, the Foundation has distributed more than \$1.6 million, with approximately half that amount to community projects and organizations and half to student scholarships.

The Wallace community is fortunate to have the Frank A. Morbeck Foundation.
