The Holohan-McKinlay building which currently houses US Bank is featured on this year's Wallace Christmas ornament. The ornaments are on sale at the Chamber office, Idaho Silver, Price Tag and A Hint of Whimsy. Cost is \$8 each. The Holohan-McKinlay Building, sometimes referred to as the O'Neil Samuels Building, was built in 1900 and features a cut-corner entrance with a Corinthiancolumned entry. At one time the ground floor housed five separate stores. For many years several professional and business officers were located on the second floor, referred to as Cozy Corners, while private residences occupied the third floor.

Proceeds from the ornament sales benefit the Chamber of Commerce.

Visitor numbers

A total of 891 people signed in at the Visitors Center

in September, compared to 1,237 visitors a year earlier and 1,653 in September 2010. Volunteers logged 180 hours. Visitors were from 42 states and 12 countries, with Washington accounting for 110, followed by Montana and Canada with 37 each.

Wallace loses to Calif. Town

The Victorian Village in Ferndale, Calif. edged out Wallace to win the Prettiest Painted Places in America (under 10,000 population) for the Northwest region. Another California town, Eureka, won the over 10,000 category for the Northwest. Wallace was one of 10 Northwest finalists.
